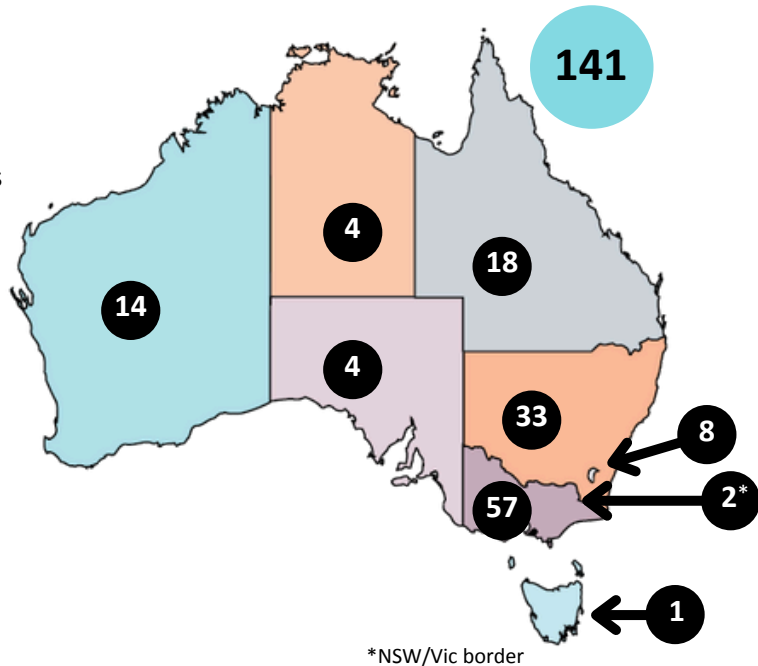


# Health justice landscape

## December 2024 snapshot

Health Justice Australia has identified 141 health justice partnerships operating in Australia, providing legal help to clients in a variety of health and community services and settings. Health justice partnership lawyers support clients with problems that can affect their health and wellbeing, such as credit, debt, fines, social security, housing, family law, family violence, crime and discrimination.

Health justice partnerships vary considerably and support a wide range of people, including those experiencing family violence or elder abuse, people experiencing mental health and/or alcohol and other drug related issues, young people and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. By working together, partnering health, community and legal services can assist clients they have in common in ways that they cannot achieve alone.

## Health settings

- 57** services are present in hospitals
- 33** in community settings
- 40** in primary health settings (other than Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander health services)

## Legal partners

- 36** partnerships involve legal aid commissions
- 104** involve generalist or specialist community legal centres
- 6** involve other types of legal services



80 services target those experiencing or at risk of domestic and family violence



33 services target those experiencing mental health issues or addiction

Note a partnership may involve multiple types of health and legal partners, may be present in multiple types of settings and may target multiple groups of clients.

All figures are to the best of Health Justice Australia's knowledge, based on information that has been provided by services through surveys and/or ongoing interaction. Numbers may fluctuate as services evolve or when additional data or corrections are received.
